From the Pastor's Pen

Dear friends,

In 2015 the document "*Declaration on the Way: Church, Ministry and Eucharist*" was published. It is a declaration of the consensus achieved by Lutherans and Catholics on the topics of church, ministry and Eucharist; it states 32 things we agree upon. It is part of an ongoing dialogue since 1965 here in the states, and it recognizes commonalities and things yet to be resolved. It is a HUGE step toward Christian unity and joint commitment to witness to the Word and Work of God.

On Oct. 31 of 2017 a document was signed entitled "Joint Statement on the Occasion of the Catholic-Lutheran Commemoration of the Reformation. [A copy will be put up on the bulletin board.] Representatives from the ELCA and the Roman Catholic Church signed this document. This Document is about recognizing our need for unity in Jesus' name, and it was in Christ's prayer on our behalf, "*that they may all be one. As you, Father, are in me and I am in you, may they also be in us, so that the world may believe that you have sent me.*"

This is part of what is said within this document: We emphatically reject all hatred and violence, past and present, especially that expressed in the name of religion... we hear God's command to set aside all conflict... We pray to God that Catholics and Lutherans will be able to witness together to the Gospel of Jesus Christ... that we may stand together in service, upholding human dignity and rights... We urge Lutherans and Catholics to work together to welcome the stranger, to come to the aid of those forced to flee because of war and persecution, and to defend the rights of those who seek asylum... as part of the Body of Christ, into which we are incorporated through Baptism... to be faithful heralds of God's boundless love for all humanity.

We have come a long way since 1517 and the war over the ideas that the Reformation raised. But the topic of grace is never old. The idea to hold Scripture as the written source for which all else is based upon - should never be forgotten and upheld. The belief that salvation comes through Christ alone – is primary and crucial to the Christian faith; as Luther would say – this is most certainly true. But – we still need to be courteous and compassionate of those who do not yet understand this.

Our common goal, our Great Commission, is to make disciples of all people, to teach them all we know about Jesus Christ, to Baptize in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Matthew 28. Christians divided has never been the answer, and never



solved anything. There is room for different interpretations. There is room for different worship and music 'stylings'. There should never be room for hatred among our brothers and sisters of the Christian faith. Mug slinging has to stop, mutual respect encouraged, for the work of Christ must continue.
