From the Pastor's Pen

April showers bring May flowers! But for me, and for many, this is allergy season. I sneeze, my eyes get puffy and my nose is stuffy. But I will endure. I love flowers, the delicate leaves, the green of the stem and the scent that is not the smell of winter. Giggle. God is so good. He gives us so much to delight our senses: things to touch and to smell, things to taste, and wonders to behold and curiosities hear. I stopped the other day in the parking lot just to listen to the robins. The other night I heard a raccoon, not sure that delighted me... but it is a neat sound. Have you ever heard a turkey and think it sounds kind of like a rusty door?

I thank the good Lord for the gift of all my senses. We can too often take them for granted – until we start to lose them. At times I found myself wondering about those with diabetes that loose sensation in their feet. And as we age, our eyes aren't as elastic as they once were, making the fine print even harder to see. These losses are part of the natural order of life, and to help, I hope people will use the tools on hand, such as the hearing devices in church. They are simple to use and they help significantly to listen to the worship service.

We are almost done renovating two of our bathrooms to be more wheelchair accessible. They are now 'Family bathrooms', meaning they are no longer male or female – just make sure to lock the door when you enter. This is one place where a surprise visitor is not needed.

Another thing we have to help as our bodies lose capabilities are a couple of wheelchairs by the ramp doors. We also have our chair-lift. If you are struggling with stairs, having a bad knee day or what have you, please use this tool. There is nothing to be embarrassed about in using it, just as there is no shame with using a cane or walker. Better safe than sorry. The lift is slow like a herd of turtles, doesn't bite and will get you to where you need to be. I have used it, especially after my surgery, and was thankful to have it.

Take 10 minutes and look around, touch the petal of a flower, take a deep breath, what are the different things you are smelling? Spring is in the air; can you taste it? Praise be to God!

Approved via email vote after last month's meeting for a room at the Kalahari for Mike & Kathy Kuss to attend the Synod Assembly in May.

Motion made by Marty Hillert to approve the property committee's recommendation for Dellwood Plumbing & Heating's install of a new Carrier air conditioner at a cost of \$2995.

Tom second/motion carried.

Tom discussed the reconstruction of the fellowship back steps. General Engineering recommends that the exit needs to be brought up to code, they are including in their plans an enclosed staircase with foundation, insulated walls and a roof. The upper landing will include a space for a wheelchair which is called an 'Area of Refuge'. Property committee is asking for \$2400 of the approved \$5200 for the step project to be used for this and re-budget \$10,000 (rough guess) for next year or vote for additional funds at the May congregational meeting. The council decided that the construction project will be postponed until we have further information. Tom made a motion to

approve the design of \$2400 for the stairway project/Marty second/motion carried.

Pastor is asking for a new mic as the current one will be banned from use in the near future. Bundy Audio can get one for \$329 for the receiver system and \$89 for Pastor's ear hook mic. Seeking up to \$450 for replacement. Tom motioned to approve the purchase/Marty second/motion carried.
