Did you know there are 3 types of love: brotherly or friendship love, romantic love and the Love of God. But did you know there are 5 languages of love? Gary Chapman in a 1995 book, "The Five Love Languages: How to Express Heartfelt Commitment to Your Mate" says they are: Gifts, spending Quality Time, Words of Affirmation (oh I like that color on you... saying 'I love you') Acts of Service (doing things for them like making their favorite cookies) and Physical Touch (hug).

It's something to think about and can aid in communication. Most of us use one or two of these more than the others, but it is also helpful to help us understand others as they express their warm thoughts towards us. Such as a spouse may not say 'I love you' very often, but will bring home your favorite chocolates or will maybe take out the trash without being asked. So it is good to know what our own love language is and that of others around us.

Christ expressed his love for others with these languages as well:

Gifts: Jesus said, 'Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you.' John 14:27

Quality Time: Many times Jesus is with his disciples and answering their questions? Words of Affirmation: Jesus said, 'So don't be afraid; you are worth more than many spar-

rows.' Matt.10:31

Acts of Service: Think about the cross.



Physical Touch: He touched the blind man's eyes, held the hand of Jairus' daughter as he brought her back to life.

Think on this – Jesus speaks to us love – in every language.
