Activity: Make a bouncy ball: Need Borax, water, corn starch, glue, 2 cups, food coloring, stirring sticks.

Label 2 cups:1 and 2

In first plastic cup add 4 ounces of warm water, 1 tsp. borax powder, stir.

In second cup: 1 Tbsp. of white glue and food coloring if desired.

Add from cup 1 add to cup 2, a ½ teaspoon of borax solution, plus 1 Tbsp. of cornstarch to the glue mixture, but DO NOT stir. Wait for 10 -15 seconds, then stir to fully mix.

When hard to stir, start to mold into a ball; it will be sticky and messy at first. Continue molding until smooth and round. (wash hands.)
