From the Pastor's Pen

Dear friends,

It has been a long hall waiting for things to open again. Now that some things have opened, I know you will take precautions as you start to venture out and about. The Church Council and Worship Committee have discussed our possible re-opening, as well. We discussed our average age, public health concerns, what, if anything, would make people comfortable coming back to our space, and we read the recommendations by the medical experts.

It was decided that for now, we will remain closed. This was a calm and rational decision, one that was not made out of fear, but out of concern for everyone's wellbeing. I know some of you are disappointed, some relieved that we are not rushing our re-opening.

Thank you for understanding, for your support, prayers and generosity!

Once we do re-open some things will need to change at least temporarily. First thoughts, hymnals cannot be sanitized, also bulletins/paper, therefore, we will probably go paperless, putting the whole worship service, including the hymns, on the screen. I know this is not ideal, but reduces touched surfaces. Also, if you wish to have your own hymnal to use at home, call the office by June 8th. Amy is putting together an order, new hymnals are \$33.25/hymnal.

We are looking at how greeters can welcome you safely. We are thinking about how to serve Holy Communion differently, and how to receive the offering without passing the plate, another contact surface. Choir for now is on hold. Experts are saying that public singing is not recommended, because of the deep breathing and the volume of air expelled outward. It's a possibility that we might seat people every other pew or every other two.

Here are some ways you can continue to pray and worship together: Participate in the on-line worship services on YouTube.com (search Arkdale Trinity Lutheran Church). If you'd like, a paper copy of the sermon can be mailed to you. You can also request to receive the weekly e-mailed devotion. Simply call the office, 564-7920. On the Arkdale Trinity Facebook page there is a prayer posted daily, as well as the links to the Sunday worship services. Another way to stay connected is to consider getting your church pictorial out and pick 2 people a week or daily to call and pray for. Perhaps send a card to one of our shut-ins. Be a blessing.:)

Yes, things are changing. But **one thing that never changes - our God**: His Word - His Love - His mercy. These never change and never fail us. Faith in our Lord gives us hope, even when it seems dark.
