From the Pastor's Pen

Dear friends,

Last month I lost some dear family members and a close friend. I thank God for the gifts they were to me and that I was able to attend their funerals. Unfortunately this also meant that I had a couple hotel stays. But in preparing to speak at my friend's service, I pulled out the Bible in the hotel night stand for I did not have mine with me. I was able to find and read passages - and found comfort in those words. It was a Bible donated by the Gideons International. It's almost a given that there would be a Bible in every hotel room and in hospital rooms. That is how successful the ministry of the Gideons has been - placing Bibles in millions of rooms, globally.

These Bibles placed in so many locations - do make a difference. Not only have I used one on several occasions, but also thousands of people everywhere. For some picking up this Bible will be their first time. Think about all the flight attendants world-wide... think of all their stay-overs every week – all year long - there will be a Bible in their room. Think of the nurses and doctors who may need His Word or a patient...

In Matthew 28:19-20 we are told that we are to make disciples, to Baptize and to teach them all we know about our Lord. His Word is a great place to start. And the Gideons do all they do through our donations and volunteers. They place over 1,000,000 Bibles and Testaments in 200 different countries, in 101 different languages – every 4 days! And because God's Word is so important that's why we, every fall, place a Bible in the hands of our 3rd graders. FYI: There are cards in the narthex to use to make a donation to the Gideons on behalf of someone, for example: 10 Bibles in celebration of their birthday or in their memory, perhaps in celebration of an anniversary.

On another note – sometimes a Bible becomes damaged. For a broken binding, one option is getting a Bible rebound. There is nothing that I have found in scripture about what to do with an old Bible. My confirmation Bible got left outside in a rain storm – sadly it was unusable after that. While it is not the paper or ink or the Bible itself that we worship – for we worship the Lord himself, we do hold the pages in respect for they teach us of our Lord and Savior. Bibles that are complete can be given away, donated or saved as family heirlooms.

As to what to do with one that is damaged might I suggest retiring it with respect. Perhaps like we do with a flag, we can burn it. And instead of saying the pledge of Allegiance, one could recite scripture such as from Psalm 119:103-105, "How sweet are your words to my taste, sweeter than honey to my mouth! Through your precepts I get understanding; therefore I hate every false way. Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path."

<u>Bible Moment</u>: <u>Mark 9:31</u>, "The Son of Man is to be betrayed into human hands, and they will kill him, and <u>three days</u> after being killed, he will rise again." Jonah after 3 days in the belly of a large fish was sent to Nineveh (a city taking <u>3 days</u> to walk across) to bring God's word that would lead to their salvation through repentance. Jesus after <u>3 days</u> of death, brought God's salvation for all human kind.

As for the 3 days, it was common to count any part of the day as the day, so Friday, Saturday and Sunday = 3 days. We know from history he rose Sunday morning, because the early Christians changed their time of worship to Sunday morning because of Easter's joy! And hence we say that every Sunday is a little Easter. For other references to "three days" check out: 1 Samuel 30:12; Esther 4:16; Mark 8:2; Matthew 27:40. **Blessed Easter!!** (Services are at 6, 8 & 10:15 am on Easter, April 1st!)

KFC – Kids For Christ

*No Sunday school April 1st for Easter. Youth are serving breakfast, 7 & 9 am. *Youth-led Worship Service is Sunday, April 15th at 10:15 am. Invite your neighbors! *Bible Verse: Matthew 7:26, "But everyone who hears these words of mine and does not put them into practice is like a foolish man who built his house on SAND."

*Activity: Kinetic SAND: Materials: 2 cups fine sand, 1 tablespoon cornstarch, 2 teaspoons dish soap, water, as needed, food coloring of choice. **Directions:** In a large bowl whisk together fine sand & cornstarch. Add dish soap & 1/4 cup water. Mix until fully combined. If necessary, add more water, 1/4 cup at a time. Continue stirring until desired consistency is reached. You may wish to divide sand into separate bowls & then add food coloring, mixing until desired color is reached. Let sand dry for 2 hours. Remember, kinetic sand is **NOT** edible!

Stewardship Moment: Plastic is everywhere these days. And scientists are saying there are plastic 'micro-fibers' being found now in some sources of drinking water. The long term effect of this is still unknown. Scary thought. A lot of single-serving frozen dinners use plastic containers, and yes, this is very convenient. However if you are a consumer, is there a way to reduce using so many? Consider washing and reusing zip-lock baggies; maybe use wax paper to wrap your sandwich in. And don't forget to recycle those big plastic cups from the fast-food chains, keeping them out of landfills. And you may already be using re-usable bags when shopping. It's time to re-think our plastic use & reuse, and lesson our consumption of plastic products when possible .
