Many reasons bring people to our place of worship. Maybe they have had a new hardship, a loved one has become ill, perhaps they are new to the area, maybe they've had a recent heartbreak.
- 2. Meet their gaze, then flash a warm smile at them.
- 3. Offer help. "It's all up on the screen"; 'Here's the Communion elements'; 'the bathrooms are down the hall', 'That's Pastor Terri over there'.
- 4. Introduce yourself.
- 5. Try to remember their name; write it down or put in your phone, maybe write it on the sign in sheet. If you see them again, it's important to use their name if you can, making them feel noticed, wanted and important.
- 6. Remember they are a person just like you, needing a connection with others.
- 7. And yet, respect boundaries. They may not be ready to talk or may be a private person. This one you just have to feel out.
- 8. Let me know if I need to follow-up with them.

Matt. 18:5, 'Whoever welcomes one such child in my name welcomes me."

I read somewhere, "As the body of Christ, *we are* the fleshy arms and legs of <u>Jesus</u>, and just as Christ calls us to be the Church, the church needs you to notice new people". - **★Pizza Prep** is Friday, March 17th at the Adams Community Center, 6pm: unload food, set up tables, etc.
- **★Make Pizzas** Saturday, the 18th, at the Center, 8-12pm. <u>Volunteers needed!</u>
- **★Bible Verse**: 'The **owl** will nest there and lay eggs; she will hatch them, and care for her young under the shadow of her wings.' Isaiah 34:15.
- ★Activity: Yarn Owl: Need: yarn, stick, a pipe cleaner, some felt, glue, scissors, 2 large white buttons, 2 black buttons & piece of cardboard about 3×4". Cut pipe cleaner in 1/2; punch 2 holes near bottom of cardboard & attach pipe cleaners for legs by inserting halfway, bend & twist once, then twist around the stick. Cut 2 triangle pieces of felt for ears & glue to each top corner. You are ready to yarn. Make a small slit near the bottom to hook the yarn in & begin wrapping the cardboard until covered. Cut string & tuck the end. Glue small black buttons to white buttons & then glue to the owl as eyes. Cut a slip triangle & glue this as a beak between the eyes. Tada!
- **★Table Talk:** Have you ever seen an owl? They are up when we are sleeping. Why do you think their eyes are so large compared to their bodies? (To see their supper better.)
- **★Bedtime Prayer:** As I settle in my bed, help me rest my little head. Bless my family and the ones I love; watch me like the owls, from up above. Amen.
