

The Story Behind Hymn "Spirit, Spirit of Gentleness" by James K. Manley

The refrain goes "Spirit, Spirit of gentleness, blow through the wilderness calling and free; Spirit, Spirit of restlessness, stir me from placidness, Wind, Wind on the sea. © 1978 James K. Manley. All rights reserved.

James Keith Manley was born in Holyoke, Massachusetts, in 1940 and is an Ordained Pastor of the United Church of Christ. He has toured and shared his music during his retire-



ment in churches in the United States, Canada, Australia, and Micronesia. Recent songs have focused on mitigating the effects of climate change and living creatively in a global community.

Manley wrote "Spirit of Gentleness" in 1975, sometimes called "Spirit Song," and was first released on a cassette recording titled Spirit. Side note: A friend had commented to him that it needed a fourth verse; Jim disagreed, but after a sleepless night, wrote the final verse.

As is the case with many hymns on the Holy Spirit, the refrain of the hymn assumes the prayer posture of a petition - "blow through the wilderness" and "stir me from placidness." The composer recognizes two contrasting qualities of the Holy Spirit: "gentleness" and "restlessness." The final phrase, "wind on the sea," reminds us of Genesis 2b: "and the Spirit of God was hovering over the waters".

Each stanza unfolds a particular manifestation of the Spirit. Stanza 1 ends with two petitions: "Awake from your slumbers" (Eph 5:14) and "rise on your wings". Isa 40:31. The final stanza reminds us that Spirit is still speaking today by "breaking ancient schemes." Drawing up images familiar in passages from Luke 4:18–19, the Spirit frees those in the "bondage of sorrow." It enables "captives to dream dreams." Repeating Acts 2:17, "our women see visions - our men clear their eyes." With simple lines and imagery this hymn brings the Spirit's presence as a partner in the Trinity.

But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. Against such things, there is no law. Gal 5:2
