### October 2024 ..... From the Pastor's Pen

Dear friends, this time of year the leaves start to change, we conclude our gardens except for a few gourds, squash and pumpkins. And so I googled: What can we learn from pumpkins? Here are a few of the answers I found.

#1 is Your size, color and shape don't matter. I know some look for the most perfect pumpkin for carving, some for baking or decorating, some for the most unique. You were created by God; accept yourself.

#2 Sometimes we need to remove the muck from inside. For us the muck is sin and temptation. Do what you can to remove it and seek foraiveness.

#3 People may only like you for a season. Your worth and character come from within and your connection to God. Friends are to be supportive of each other and help each other. But some people in our lives are like those stores that pop up in a mall; just there for a limited time and then move on. Appreciate them while you can. This is not a reflection of you.

#4 Creativity is limitless. Sometimes you just have to think outside the pumpkin (box). #5 You may look great on the outside, but it is what is on the inside that makes you shine. Reflecting the Lord in our life, - being a person of character, being kind, compassionate, honest, etc. - that is what is going to make you shine - Shine for Jesus!

Flat or pre-folded cloth diapers – Each kit needs four.
 They are available at Wal-Mart in the baby dept. Total need is 280.

2. Cotton hand towels – Dark-colored towels are preferred (no white). Minimum size is 15"x18" and 25"x30" is the maximum.

3. Gentle soap bath bars – Two 4-oz (or three 3-oz) bath bars are required for each kit. They must be in original wrapping, but **cannot** be hotel or mini bars of soap. We need bars for 70 kits.

**Ramp Hill Update**: Ramp Hill Phase I **Dedication** was held on September 8, 2024. Didn't this project turn out beautiful? The committee consists of Brian and Donna Olson, Tim Meyer, Tom Guzman, Glenn Quinnell, as chair/secretary/project manager, John Easterly as a landscape guide, and Garret Gould is a liaison to the council. They are a great group. We were so blessed to find the TK Design Company to design this project for us. Architect Mark Schmidt did a great job with the State design for permit approval.

We spent just over \$100,000 for phase I and have received gifts of over \$60,000. We used a line of credit loan for up to \$50,000. We have members that have committed \$470 per month to make the loan payments. We continue to receive gifts and recently received over \$1,000 for the wall and seat wall lights and \$1,900 the previous week. We thank you for your continued support. These and any additional gifts will help to pay off the loan faster and save interest money.

Phase II consists of installing a canopy over the automatic doors with support posts on the patio concrete which has the foundations in place. We are on hold for this \$40,000 project until we have funding.

Phase III will be an LED sign placed on the wall just below the brick band facing Church Street. This sign will indicate "TRINITY LUTHERAN CHURCH" and cost around \$12,785. The wall is already prepared with electric conduit. This is also waiting for funding.

We need to thank the congregation and council. We could not have done this project without your support! We also express our thanks to the following: **Property Works- John Easterly** for seat wall, rock, lights, and blacktop. They also removed blacktop and concrete and installed a roof water drain field as well as the steps. **Brothers Concrete** Company from Wautoma for doing the concrete work. **Kingdom Stone-Rick Koren**, for installing the face stone and brick. **Kilbourn Home Improvement-David Delmore** for installing the rails. **Laridaen Glass**-moving the automatic doors. **Silver Maples-Kurt Mikolite** for removing/installing trim around automatic doors. **David Janssen** for installing tile floor around handicap doors. **Jeff Chase** for removing and installing sheet rock around the automatic doors. **Dennis McClyman and Patrick Murphy** for painting the automatic door entrance.

May this beautiful wall be a call to worship to the community around us. Thanks be to God!

**One Dish Pork Chop Dinner - Elaine Morgan (from** *Recipes & Memories Cookbook***)** 

8 pork chops 6 c. shredded cabbage 1/3 c. flour (plus coating)

1/4 c. butter

2 lb. small red potatoes 2 c. apple juice (divided) 1 lb. small onions

1 lb. small carrots



Salt & pepper to taste

Flour chops; brown in butter in a Dutch oven. Remove chops. Stir 1/3 c. flour into pot; cook and stir until a paste forms. Whisk in  $1\frac{1}{2}$  c. apple juice; blend until smooth. Return chops to pot; cover and bake at  $350^{\circ}$  for 30 min. Add veggies and rest of apple juice; cover and bake 30 min. Top with cabbage; cover and bake  $1\frac{1}{2}$  hours until chops are tender, basting occasionally.
