From the Pastor's Pen...June 2025

Dear Friends,

Jesus' last command before his ascension was to love others as he loves us. Sometimes this feels like the hardest command to carry out, and this is probably why there are at least 35 verses in the Bible that have the words Jesus and love in them (*depending on your translation*). But don't you think there are more good people out there than bad apples? Yes, it's scary out there, but there is so much goodwill too. It's just that most of the news reports and social media posts focus on the terrible stuff.

There's a book by Charlie Mackesy called, 'The Boy, The Mole, The Fox and The Horse', which is a story about a curious boy, a greedy mole, a suspicious fox and a wise horse. Traveling together they share their greatest fears and discoveries about vulnerability, kindness, hope, friendship and love. The last line of the book is this, "Sometimes all you hear about is the hate, but there is more love in this world than you could possibly imagine." I want to believe this is true!

Monkey Bread from Kathy Laskowski (Recipes & Memories ATLC Cookbook, p. 97)

3 large can biscuits 1 Tbsp. cinnamon 1 cup sugar

Pecans, chopped 1 stick margarine 1 cup brown sugar

Cut biscuits in 4-6 pieces and shake in cinnamon and sugar mixture. Layer biscuits and pecans in well-greased Bundt pan. Melt margarine and brown sugar. Boil for 1 minute. Pour over biscuits in Bundt pan. Bake at 350° for 30 minutes. Turn onto plate immediately. Pull apart to eat.




