From the Pastor's Pen...July 2025

Dear Friends, Too often we have heard someone saying, 'back in the good old days...' Sometimes people get stuck wishing for the past that they fail to live in the present. Ecclesiastes 7:10 has some advice for us: 'Do not say, "Why were the former days better than these?" For it is not from wisdom that you ask this.' When longing for what was, we can miss the good stuff of today. Similar to Lot's wife, who in looking back became a pillar of salt, we become stuck, trapped.



In my first parish, there was a dear woman who had lost her husband in her early 30s. This 80+ year old woman would spend every visit I made to her bemoaning the loss of her 'perfect' husband. She'd complain about her lazy son. She'd complain that her friends no longer visited. I tried to point out that her son came every week, cleaned the house, mowed the lawn, filled her fridge, took her to all of her appointments, and made sure she had her hair done monthly—and he had a family and grandkids to take care of. But nothing her friends or her son could do was ever enough. She wished her husband was still with her so things would be different... It was difficult to visit her; her complaining drove her friends away. She was stuck in the past and was truly ungrateful. And because her focus was so swayed to the past, she couldn't love or engage with those in her present daily life.

God gives us wisdom, wisdom to protect us. In that wisdom, we learn to be grateful and live for today and plan for tomorrow. Wisdom tells us that yesterday cannot come back and that tomorrow isn't here yet.

Ecclesiastes has more to tell us in the next verses: 'Wisdom is as good as an inheritance, an advantage to those who see the sun. For the protection of wisdom is like the protection of money, and the advantage of knowledge is that wisdom gives life to the one who possesses it. Consider the work of God.' Then, in verse 14 comes even greater wisdom: 'In the day of prosperity, be joyful, and in the day of adversity, consider: God has made the one as well as the other...' (the day of prosperity and the day of adversity).

Remember fondly things from the past. Learn and use the lessons learned from before. But live in the now. And BE grateful to the Lord! Follow the words of Psalm 118: This is the day — Today is the day — the Lord has made. Let us rejoice and be glad in it!!

The meeting was called to order by President Garret Gould at 5:35 p.m.

Approve Agenda: Add #4. Council Restructure under New Business; move Solar Project to end of Old Business (6), moving other items up. Agenda approved.

Opening devotion/prayer: Pastor read from Ecclesiastes3:1-2 followed with discussion on what we have accomplished and looking forwards to next year and a prayer.

Approve May Council Meeting Minutes: Motion to approve the minutes by Dana Henriksen, second by Mike Willis. Carried.

Approve May Treasurer's Report: Checkbook balance and budget were reviewed by Treasurer Cathy Westover. Motion to approve the report made by Mike Willis, seconded by Gretchen Wetzel. Carried.

Pastor's Report: Visits in last 6 weeks: 15. At Rest: 1 service at Trinity and 1 non-member in Wis. Rapids. At the Altar: None. At the Font: 1 in June and 1 in August. Other: Rev. Shelley Nelson will be our quest Pastor July 20, 2025, while Pastor is on vacation.

Next Council Meeting will be July7, 2025 at 5:30 p.m.

Old Business:

- 1. Wi-Fi/ phones update: Waiting for information on the fiber optic line being installed on the highway.
- 2. Door camera: Ken is still researching based on what will work best with our system and needs.
- 3. Servant Keeper: Danna gave us information on 3 packages available with cost. She recommends the Good/Basic package for \$769.89/yr (\$69.99/mo.). Motion to purchase the Good/Basic Package made by Cathy Westover, second by Dana Henricksen. Carried.
- 4. Pastor's new computer: Danna will order.
- 5. Church Long Range Plan: It was recommended that we get a copy of the old plan that was done some years ago, then the Council can plan how to proceed. Garret will check with several members who may have knowledge of the old plan.
- 6. Solar Project (next steps for funding) The Congregation has approved to proceed with the project, A Grant will cover ½ the cost of the panels which leaves approximately \$44,650 cost for the remaining panels. We will check with the bank on financing. Cathy Westover moved to information on a \$45,000 loan with a fixed rate, second by Dana Henriksen. Carried.

New Business:

- 1. Chip Seal Contract: Glenn Quinnell provided a bid from Scott Construction, Inc. to chip and seal the area in front of the new wall and cub on the front side of the church. The cost is \$2,150.00. Motion made by Gretchen Wetzel to approve the bid, seconded by Leif Pedersen. Carried.
- 2. Review committee liaison assignment: Education: Carrie Easterly; Outreach: Cathy Westover; Property Committee: Leif Pedersen; Landscape/Ramp Hill Committee: Garret Gould; Worship Ministry: Dana Henriksen and Mike Willis; TLCW: Dana Henriksen and Sandy Willis; Endowment Committee: Gretchen Wetzel; Care & Creation Committee: Carrie Easterly, Dana Henriksen & Liz Hendricksen.
- 3. Restructure Council Officers: Current officers are: President: Garret Gould, Vice President: Mike Willis, Treasurer: Cathy Westover, Secretary: Sandy Willis. Motion made by Gretchen Wetzel to keep the officers the same, second by Dana Henriksen. Carried.

Committee Reports:

- 1. Education Ministry: Sunday School has ended, and Confirmation is over for the summer, both resume in the fall. Planning for Brat Fry, 4th of July parade, VBS: August 12 and a mini golf outing.
- 2. Outreach: need to find a member to take Susie Smiith's place.
- 3. Property Committee: will be meeting on June 6,2025.

John's Super Chocolate Chip Cookie from Carrie Easterly (Recipes & Memories Cookbook, p. 122)

3/4 c. butter flavor Crisco 1-1/4 c. light brown sugar 2 Tbsp. milk 1 Tbsp. vanilla

1 egg 1-3/4 c. all-purpose flour 1 tsp. salt 3/4 tsp. baking soda

1-1/2 c. semi-sweet choc. Chips 1 c. pecan pieces, chopped (opt.)

Heat oven to 375°. Combine Crisco, brown sugar, milk, & vanilla and beat at medium speed until creamy. Beat egg into creamed mixture. Combine flour, salt, baking soda, and stir in chocolate chips and pecans. Shape and place onto cookie sheet. Bake for 8-10 minutes for chewy cookies or 11-13 minutes for crispy cookies. Makes approximately 3 dozen 3" cookies.

Stewardship Ideas: Of the 3 R's (Reduce, Reuse, Recycle) **Reduce** is the most important. You might think you're not contributing to ocean trash because you'd never litter at the beach, but our rivers and creeks here in WI are impacted with trash: bottles, toy bits, plastic bags and even yogurt containers. And placing an item in your recycling bin is no guarantee it actually gets recycled. **Reducing** our shopping and the disposables plastic we use is overall a better action. For example: In Adams, our drinking water has concerns. At first I thought of using bottled water for drinking, but I didn't like the idea of all the plastic bottles. So, we put a filter on our sink faucet and purchased a filtering water pitcher so we can fill our reusable drinkware with this filtered water eliminating the need to purchase bottled water.






