

From the Pastor's Pen October 2025

Dear Friends.



When you hear someone using words that are vague such as 'they' or 'those' or 'them' - ask who are the 'they'. Ask - what do they mean? What are they implying? I hear things that demonize those who are not of the same thinking that they are. Words that dehumanize certain groups of people, making them less-than-human, less valuable, less wanted, people who are not worth their time - be it their culture, race, orientation, or their color. Even among Christians there is divisive rhetoric; some claiming to be Christians but who differentiate themselves from other believers, thinking themselves more righteous or better, claiming things like: "they are not us," creating a lesser Christian category. A few even hint that those who are not with us are against us enemies. All this is wrong and can lead to making the 'thems' less important to help, and may lead to targeting the 'thems' as scape goats. Adam blamed Eve for his own sin. Are we not all sinners and less than perfect? Pay attention! And don't fall into that kind of thinking.

Galatians 3:28 says: "There is no longer Jew or Greek; there is no longer slave or free; there is no longer male and female, for all of you are one in Christ Jesus." There should be no "us" or "them." Jesus asks us to welcome the stranger, feed the hungry, protect the meek. Jesus wasn't focused on simply staying pure, nor above; he didn't separate himself from others. Jesus comes to us, and is focused on reaching out and saving people. His hands made mud and gave sight. He ate with sinners. He touched the lepers. His feet got dirty walking from town to town to share the Good News. Colossians 3:12 "As God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, clothe yourselves with Compassion, Kindness, Humility, Meekness, and Patience."

Ephesians 4:1-6— "I (Paul) ... beg you to walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, making every effort to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace: there is **one** body and **one** Spirit, just as you were called to the **one** hope of your calling, **ONE** LORD, **one** faith, one baptism, ONE GOD and Father of all, who is above all and through all and in all.

We can worship in different stylings, sing different hymns of praise (be it with an organ or guitar or drum), we can worship in a building or on the sidewalk. We can worship and use dif-

ferent Bible translations. But Christians are unified in our worship of Jesus Christ alone.

Thank you for being Open to God's Word and all your efforts in the work Christ has called us to. Carry on good and faithful servants of the Lord!

Cranberry Bars (Shared by Ruth Peterson in *Recipes & Memories –ATLC* Cookbook, 1996)

1-1.2 c. flour 2 eggs, beaten 1 tsp. vanilla


2 eggs, beaten 1-1.2 c. flour
1-1/2 c. brown sugar 1/2 tsp. salt
1/2 c. margarine 2 c. whole cranberries 1/2 c. nuts, chopped 1/2 tsp. baking powder



Cream Cheese Frosting:

1 3-oz pkg. cream cheese 1/4 c. soft margarine 2 c. powdered sugar tsp. vanilla

Mix together eggs, sugar, margarine, vanilla, and nuts. Sift flour, salt, baking powder. Pour whole cranberries onto bottom of 9x13 pan which has been oiled/sprayed and floured. Mix all together (batter may be stiff). Bake at 350° for 40-50 minutes. Cool. Frost with cream cheese frosting.
