From the Pastor's Pen September 2025

Dear Friends,

Have you ever met someone who no longer goes to church or used to be a Christian? Too often people have an experience that injures their relationship with the church, and by association - with God. Sometimes their reason seems small, but some have had deep and very painful things happen to them in connection with the church, and now they will never go back.

It hurts my soul to think that one person or a committee can do enough damage to someone that they reject Jesus. This is a cautionary word for us to be careful about what we say, how we say it, and how we do things.

And if you need to respond to someone's 'church' pain, think about what Pastor Kelly Kopp said to those who have been hurt, "Jesus would never hurt you. People did... Church didn't die on the cross for you. And a Pastor didn't walk out of a tomb. A small group never carried your shame. And a... committee never brought you boldness and power. JESUS DID."

The pain and the hurt are real. But why do we blame Jesus for what others have done? Remember Judas, who betrayed Jesus? Note how they sat at the same table together. Jesus loved him, but Judas still did him dirty. Peter who walked on water with Jesus, but later denied knowing Jesus, not just once, but 3 times. People are the ones who mess up and cause pain, people fail. Not Jesus. Jesus doesn't mess up and is always faithful. And we worship Jesus — inside the imperfections of his church — which, if we look all through the years, has always been messy. And FYI that is why we need Jesus in the first place.

Pastor Kelly also said, "If someone hurting you in God's name made you abandon God himself, that means they had more influence on your soul than HE (God) did". And that is not God's fault. Don't let the actions of mere mortals, get between you and your Savior, Jesus Christ.

Jesus was insulted, lied about and mocked by the religious folks around him, abandoned by the people he loved, and he still said as he was dying on the cross "Father, forgive them." Sadly, Church hurt is real - but so is God's healing, grace, and mercy.

The meeting was called to order by President Garret Gould at 5:30 p.m.

Approve Agenda: Motion to approve the agenda by Mike/Gretchen. Carried.

Opening devotion and prayer: Pastor read from Phillipians 1- discussion on who and what are we thankful for within the group; followed with prayer.

Approve July Council Meeting Minutes: Motion to approve the minutes Dana/Carrie. Carried.

Approve June & July Treasurer's Reports: Reviewed and discussed. Motion to approve by Mike/Liz. Carried.

Old Business:

- Wi-Fi/Phones update: Spectrum vs. Frontier Spectrum quote highlights: a) State taxes are not included-currently 17/mo. b) representative said that 500M should be plenty and is 41% faster than Frontier. C) If we select 500M there will be an installation fee of \$99. Note: Frontier monthly payment is \$288.94 with slower speed. (Spectrum quote is attached). Garret will get more information about Mbps, phone charges, etc.

Turtle Cakes (Shared by Rita Zietlow in Recipes & Memories –ATLC Cookbook, 1996)

1 German chocolate cake mix, prepared 3/4 c. butter or margarine

1 c. chocolate chips



1 (14 oz) bag of caramels 1/2 c. evaporated milk 1 c. pecans

Mix the cake according to the directions. Grease and flour a 9"x13" pan and pour half of the cake batter into the pan. Put this half of the cake into the oven and bake at 350° for 15 minutes. In a saucepan over low heat, melt caramels with butter and milk. Remove the cake from the oven and pour the mixture from the sauce pan over the half baked cake. Top with chocolate chips and pecans. Pour the second half of the cake batter over the top and return to the oven to bake for another 20 minutes at 350°.


If living with ongoing pain is keeping you from doing the things you want to do, Healthy Living with Chronic Pain can help you manage your pain.
