Dear Friends.

You probably don't have Zechariah (John the Baptist's father) in your Nativity set! I love this part of the story. You could say that the Christmas story begins with Zechariah's silent waiting. Nine months without uttering a word. Nine months of remembering his lack of faith in the angel's promise. And nine months of anticipat-

ing the birth of his own son, who would herald the coming of the Messiah. (Luke 1:5-25, 67-80).





The meeting was called to order at 5:00 p.m.

**Agenda** was amended to add New Business: 1. Fund Raising – Leif. Motion to approve Liz/Gretchen. Carried.

**Opening devotion** and prayer by Pastor Skildum: 2 Thessalonians 3:13.

October Council Meeting Minutes: Motion to approve by Dana/Liz. Carried.

October Treasurer Report: Report & budget reviewed. Motion to approve by Liz/Gretchen. Carried.

Next council meeting: December 8, 2025, at 5:00 p.m.

### **Old Business:**

Doorbell/Ring service: we are awaiting an outlet by the office door. A bid of \$1500 was given for electricians to do the outlet. We are investigating other options such as Solar, Battery, etc.

Church Long Range Plan: awaiting the Congregational Meeting for action.

Solar Panel Update: Kyle met with the council members via phone call during the meeting. Install has been delayed and will not take place until next spring. He said we would be first on the list when weather breaks in March 2026. Arch Solar will handle the Wisconsin Review Report. We need to register the project with IRS – Arch will provide the information on how to do so. The

tax rebate is still within dates, and the Grant is good until May 31, 2026. The Committee met November 9, 2025, and attended the Council Meeting also to keep Council informed.

Outreach Coordinator Position: Kathy Murphy is interested. She reported that Ladies Night Out (Nov. 6) was successful. Let It Glow decorations need to be up by December 1. A motion to hire Kathy Murphy to fill the Outreach Coordinator position by Gretchen/Mike. Carried.

Budget Planning: final budget is due by December 8, 2025. The finance committee will meet to prepare budget for Council review.

Annual Meeting Date is January 25, 2026. The budget must be presented to the congregation 2 weeks prior to the meeting. (1/11/2026)

Fund Raising: Leif Pedersen suggested a new fundraising opportunity. After discussion it was decided that it would not be a good idea for the church.

### **Committee Reports:**

Education Ministry: Sunday School is going okay. Christmas Program will be December 14. 2025.

# **Fellowship Hosting Opportunity**


A wonderful opportunity will be opening up next spring. Fellowship will need volunteers for the Sundays of March, April and May.



Answers to Nativity Bible Trivia (on previous page): 1. Caesar Augustus. Luke 2:1. 2. False. 3. The Bible does not say how they went that 80 mile trip. They may have rode some type of animal, such as a donkey. 4. The book of Isaiah. 5. At least 3 angelic announcements for the birth of Christ and 1 for the birth of John. For Christ an angel appeared before Mary and Joseph individually and a multitude of angels spoke to the shepherds. 6. An unnamed angel in Matthew 1:21. It was assumed to be Gabriel. 7. Jesus, Emmanuel, the Christ, Wonderful, Counselor, the Mighty God, the Everlasting Father, the Prince of Peace. Isaiah 9:6; Matthew 1:21, 23. 8. Jesus means Savior and Emmanuel means God with us. 9. The wise men followed the star. The shepherds followed the angel's instructions. 10. Technically angels are never said to "sing" in the Bible. It says the angels praised God saying, "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, good will toward men." Luke 2:14. 11. A baby, wrapped in swaddling clothes, lying in a manger. 12. The Bible does not say how many there were. Tradition says there were three because of the three gifts. 13. So that he could worship the child. But his intentions were far from worship. Matthew 2:11-18. 14. Jesus was somewhere between a month old and a couple of years old. The wise men saw His star at his birth and began following it.
