Potato Cheese Soup

(Shared by Theresa Soley in *Recipes & Memories* Cookbook, p. 33)

2 c. diced potatoes

1 small onion, diced

1 stalk celery, diced

1 Tbsp. chicken bouillon

1 quart water

Place ingredients in large kettle. Boil until potatoes are done. Do NOT drain.

1/4 c. butter or margarine

2 c. milk

1/3 c. flour

1 lb. Velveeta cheese

Melt butter. Stir into flour; add milk gradually. Heat until thickened, stirring often.

Add cheese. Let cheese melt before adding potato mixture. Yield: 8 servings.

A devotional moment of prayer: Lectio Divina is a quiet, thoughtful way of reading the Bible to connect with God. It grew out of early Christian traditions and was shaped by thinkers like Augustine, who believed Scripture speaks to the heart. Augustine didn't invent the practice, but his ideas helped form its spirit—listening deeply and responding with love. Later, others gave it a clear structure, but its roots go back to that longing for God's voice.

LUTHER revised the Lectio Divina into this 3 step method:

Oratio (Prayer): This is the starting point, where one humbly prays for the Holy Spirit's guidance to understand God's Word. Luther emphasized that prayer prepares the heart and mind to receive divine wisdom.



Meditatio (Meditation): This involves deeply engaging with Scripture, not just reading it but reflecting on it repeatedly. Luther encouraged believers to "chew on" the Word, allowing its meaning to sink in and shape their thoughts and actions.

Tentatio (Struggle): Often translated as "trial" or "temptation," this refers to the challenges and spiritual battles that arise as one seeks to live according to God's Word. Luther saw these struggles as a way God refines faith, making it more resilient and authentic.

For whatever was written in former days was written for our instruction, that through endurance and through the encouragement of the Scriptures we might have hope. Romans 15:4. Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. Philippians 4:6



January Food Pantry Donation Ideas—Top 9 Needs

According to moveforhunger.org, these are the top 9 items most needed for food pantries:

- 1. Peanut Butter:** Liked by both kids and adults, and high in protein, it is the most requested item by food banks. Consider donating peanut butter alternatives too!
- 2. Canned Proteins:** Canned chicken is a great way to provide versatile, high-protein items to those in need. Items like canned tuna and salmon also contain vitamins, omega-3 fatty acids, and protein which make a quick and easy meal.
- 3. Canned Beans:** Black beans, garbanzo beans, black-eyed peas, green beans, and pinto beans are high in protein and fiber and provide a nutritious way to fill a hungry tummy.
- 4. Pasta & Pasta Sauce:** Super easy to make and exceptionally filling, pasta and pasta sauce are great items to include in your donation box. Opt for whole grain pasta since it offers more fiber and nutrition than white pasta.
- 5. Pantry Staples:** Imagine having to cook in a kitchen without any flour or sugar! Unfortunately, this is a reality for many food insecure households.
- 6. Canned Vegetables:** Always high in demand, and for good reason. Nutrient-rich, and fiber dense, they tend to last the longest in pantries and are the perfect, easy way to provide healthy options.
- 7. Cooking Essentials:** like olive oil and spices. Stick to the basics, like garlic powder, minced onion, oregano, basil, salt, pepper, and cinnamon.
- 8. Formula:** Many parents are unable to breastfeed but struggle to buy formula due to the high costs.
- 9. Baby Food.** Let's fill up the food pantry shelves!

Stewardship Idea: Consider as part of your New Year planning and goals what your offerings might be this year. Include acts of service, individually/as a family/couple.

You can call it your "First Fruits" offering.

Ideas: Volunteer at the local Adams Area Food Pantry (call [608-393-2641](tel:608-393-2641)); Neighborhood meals in Wisconsin Rapids (715-422-2050); Faith In Action of Adams County to help with: friendly visits, shopping assistance, telephone reassurance calls, home repairs, meal preparation, yard work, light housekeeping, transportation, and so on (call 608-339-0504); walk a dog at an animal shelter; visit a shut-in (see Pastor Terri); perhaps talk to someone at the elementary school to see if they need a 'grandparent' to work with kids; look through this newsletter or look to your neighbors - see a need, fill a need. It's a New Year!

★Activity: Salt Painting. Need: salt, thicker paper/paper plate, glue and paint-brush, and paint such as watercolors. Draw something such as a snowman or snowflake. Place picture on 'paint-safe' surface such as on newspaper. Trace design with Glue; while still wet, sprinkle the glue with salt, then gently tap off the excess. Using watercolor paints, gently dab salt with the paint brush or Q-Tip. Watch it fill in. Let dry.



★Table Talk: When you eat tomatoes do you flavor it with salt or sugar? Watermelon?

Mashed potatoes? When we help others or say something that blesses someone, we are "flavoring" or "salting" the world with God's love and care.
